Parts of the Sentence - Verbals - Adverb Infinitives
An <i>infinitive</i> is a <i>verbal</i> that is <i>to</i> plus a <i>verb form</i> . It can be used as an <i>adverb</i> . Examples:
to be, to see, to be seen, to be eaten
Adverb infinitives are used to modify verbs. They usually tell why.
An <i>infinitive phrase</i> is made up of an infinitive and any complements (<i>direct objects</i> , <i>predicate nominatives</i> , <i>predicate adjectives</i> , or modifiers).

1. She came to explain the answer.
2. The kids went to see the circus.
3. On the rough road I drove carefully to prevent any damage.
4. I returned a different way to avoid further damage.
