Parts of the Sentence - Clauses Review

Instructions: Using all the knowledge learned in the previous lessons, find the *verbs*, *subjects*, *predicate nominatives*, *direct objects*, *appositives*, *nouns of address*, *adjectives*, *predicate adjectives*, *adverbs*, *prepositions*, *objects of the preposition*, *indirect objects*, *objective complements*, *conjunctions*, *relative pronouns*, and *verbals* in the following sentences.

If the word is a *verbal*, tell whether it is a *gerund*, *participle*, *noun infinitive*, *adjective infinitive*, or *adverb infinitive*. If there are any *adjectives*, *adverbs*, *prepositional phrases*, *verbals*, or *verbal phrases* then tell what word they modify.

If the sentence has a *dependent clause*, tell whether it is a *adjective clause*, *adverb clause*, or *noun clause*. If it is an *adjective* or *adverb clause*, tell which word it modifies, and if it is a *noun clause* tell how they are used.

1. Joe thinks he can win at the slots.
2. That one should always do his best is certain to bring success.
3. The fact was that I was not in town.
4. The girl ran more quickly to her mother than her brother.

5. Although a skilled person will be better prepared, he may not find work.
