

## Lesson 84

### Parts of Speech - Conjunctions

A **conjunction** is a word that joins other *words*, *phrases* (groups of words), or *clauses* (groups of words with a subject and verb).

**Subordinate conjunctions** join **dependent clauses** (a sentence that must be attached to another clause to make sense) to **independent clauses** (a sentence that makes sense by itself). Some common subordinate conjunctions are *after*, *although*, *as*, *as if*, *because*, *before*, *if*, *since*, *so that*, *than*, *unless*, *until*, *when*, *where*, and *while*.
